THE WALER



There are few places in the country that offer as many ways to enjoy the water as Chesapeake, Virginia. Whether your go-to vessel is powered by motor, sail, or paddle, Chesapeake is ready when you are.

Chesapeake is located at Mile Marker 12 on the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway, a 3,000-mile waterway along the Atlantic and Gulf coasts of the Eastern United States. It provides a navigable route along its length without many of the hazards of travel on the open sea. Each year over 4,000 boaters ply through our waters, and Chesapeake is excited to welcome you to our coastal community. Along the way you will find Top Rack Marina which is home to the Top Rack Sea Store, along with waterfront dining at the Amber Lantern and Amber Lantern Deli. The Atlantic Yacht Basin is within walking distance of eateries, grocery, retail, and parks.

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places the Dismal Swamp Canal extends 22 miles along the

border of the Great Dismal Swamp National

Wildlife Refuge connecting the Chesapeake Bay with the Albemarle Sound. The canal is also part of the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway hosting pleasure boaters on its waters, and hikers and bikers along its banks on the **Dismal Swamp Canal Trail**. The Dismal Swamp Canal is also home to the **Paddle** For the Border event held each May where over 350 kayakers come together for this paddle event from North Carolina to Chesapeake.

You can launch your boat into the Northwest River from Bob's Fishing Hole, or rent a Jon boat for your fishing adventures. Stock up on fishing supplies and you are ready to enjoy a day of fishing in one of the most beautiful areas in southeast Virginia. You can also launch your boat or pier fish at Elizabeth River Park or one of the several locations listed to the left.



& THE LIQUID HIGHWAY

Chesapeake's Great Bridge Lock Park is the perfect place to spend an afternoon. You can picnic, play, fish and crab; but the name can be a little confusing. It might even sound like Chesapeake had a Scottish section until you see signs that read L-O-C-K as opposed to L-O-C-H. Still, it makes you think: What exactly is a lock? There has to be more to the name of this beautiful waterside park.

Locks are used to raise and lower water levels to help vessels easily travel between bodies of water. The Great Bridge Lock can hold up to 20 boats at a time while operators open and close four sets of gates and valves. What makes the Great Bridge Lock particularly unique is that it's a guard lock, meaning it protects water quality.

To understand how we got here, and what makes the Great Bridge Lock so cool, let's go back to the 19th century when the steam engine changed everything. Wind and row-powered boats gave way to huge, steam-powered vessels that could carry more goods, to more places, at a much faster rate. In Chesapeake, that meant boats needed a deeper and wider passage than the hand-dug Dismal Swamp Canal.

In 1850, steam-powered dredges called "Iron Titans," tore through tangles of roots and cypress knees to build the Albemarle and Chesapeake Canal. The Great Bridge Lock was in place to regulate travel - and business boomed. In 1912, the locks were put under the control of the Army Corps of Engineers as part of a project to connect the entire East Coast with one aquatic superhighway. In 1915, the Locks were left open as a part of this project. A few years later, in 1919, the Albemarle and Chesapeake Canal became a part of the new Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway.

Talk about a traffic boom. This waterway, still in use today, allowed vessels to travel from Florida to Maine without the dangers of the open ocean. It was a huge step for commercial and pleasure

boats alike. However, certain things started to change. With high traffic keeping the lock open, the ecosystem suffered. Animals and plants that typically thrived were adversely affected.


Here's why. On one side of the lock. freshwater flows from



the Currituck Sound in North Carolina. On the other side, salty water flows from the Elizabeth River fed by the Chesapeake Bay. Most plants and animals are suited for either fresh or saltwater. Not both. The mix caused harm to the ecosystem.

Part of what makes Chesapeake so special is its natural habitats, so action needed to be taken. A special guard lock to both protect the environment and allow for transportation was the solution. The lock was completed in 1932 and is still in use today.

Great Bridge Lock Park is not just a great spot to hang out, it's a modern marvel built to preserve the nature that Chesapeake holds so dear. So, whether you want to cast a line, have a picnic, launch a boat, or just relax and read on a beautiful day, Great Bridge Lock Park is the perfect place to enjoy nature and let the moments begin.

KAYAKING WITH KEVIN FONDA

As the owner/operator of Adventure Kayak Tours, and a kayaking enthusiast for most of my life, I love when someone wants to paddle one of my favorite spots. In fact, I recently received a call from a woman who wanted to check out Chesapeake's Northwest River Natural Area Preserve and I proudly told her I refer to that route as the "Paddle of Paradise."

Then she told me where she was visiting from... Alaska. I couldn't help being intimidated. We've all seen pictures of the sprawling glacial vistas and untouched wilderness.

About an hour into her rental she gave me a call.

"This place is amazing," she said. "I don't think I've booked a kayak long enough. Can I extend my rental?"

That call confirmed what I've known for years: Chesapeake's beauty can hang in there with some of the most famous scenery in the world. I've lived here for more than a decade and the pristine, one-of-a-kind natural setting is a big part of what drew me to the area and inspired me to make kayaking my profession. The routes I take my clients on in Chesapeake have no wind. No waves. No big boats forming wakes. In Chesapeake it's just you, the kayak and lush scenery that hasn't changed for hundreds of years.

Words can't do it justice. Beyond the beauty, kayaking is essentially cheap therapy. When you're out on the water, completely removed from the hustle and bustle of the outside world, it clears your mind and helps you get perspective on the things that really matter.

It's serenity. It's peace and quiet. And if you're in Chesapeake, you owe it to yourself to give it a try.





Considered one of the best fishing spots in the country, Chesapeake offers a rare mix of pier and shoreline fishing - including both saltwater and freshwater fishing. Marinas and bait and tackle shops are numerous and the crabbing is second to none.

Winter striper and yellow perch are a catch away in **Northwest** River Park. Lake Lesa is stocked with trout November - April. The park also offers classes in fly fishing throughout

the season as an alternative to traditional pole fishing.

Buy your bait, and launch or rent your boat at **Bob's Fishing Hole**.

And make sure to participate in one of the many tournaments throughout the year, where you can catch bass, catfish, perch, crappie and bluegill - from the shore or via boat.






HAPPY TRAILS TO YOU

Hikers, bikers, birders and dog walkers unite! Chesapeake has open trails that create a combined 353 square miles of some of the most immersive outdoor experiences in the country.

The Chesapeake Arboretum is a 48-acre sanctuary with botanical garden, vast vibrant florals, historic indigenous trees, and a host of trails – the longest of which is 1.1 miles. Tree lovers make swift tracks to the picturesque Lake Hughes, the Holly Garden, Native Woodland Garden or Stewartia Grove. The Camellia Cover is on the National Camellia Trail and doesn't disappoint. The Dismal Swamp Canal Trail is an 8.3-mile-long, paved multi-use trail that runs along the Dismal Swamp Canal. Nearby, the Black Bear Trail is a one-mile trail in to the Great Dismal Swamp National Wildlife Refuge that is great for biking, hiking and birding. Or stroll along the more than seven miles of winding trails at Northwest River Park and Campground.

Raised berm area, with interpretive signage explaining the lock system, permits spectators a great view of the many yachts that transit the lock on this busy waterway.

Great Dismal Swamp National Wildlife Refuge

Over 112,000 acres of forested wetlands in southeastern Virginia and northeastern North Carolina with the 3,100-acre Lake Drummond at the center.

Indian River Park

Northwest River Park and Campground

BIRDING

Chesapeake has been a nationally recognized bird watcher's oasis since the 17th century. Recognized as one of the country's greatest birding sites, the Virginia Birding and Wildlife Trail - South Chesapeake Loop provides sanctuary to over 213 species of birds.

Five stops on the trail provide visitors the chance to catch a glimpse of resident species as well as more than 200 different kinds of neo-tropical songbirds during the spring and fall migration season.

Virginia Birding and Wildlife Trail - South Chesapeake Loop

The sites in the South Chesapeake Loop offer a sample of habitats at the interface of pinewoods and the swampy bottomlands lining several rivers that drain the southeastern corner of the state. Typically, sites on this loop present a diverse assortment of wildlife that reflects this amalgam of habitats. At a single site, visitors may encounter birds ranging from nuthatches flitting through the pines, to prothonotary warblers nesting in hollow swamp trees, to stealthy great blue herons hunting in the shallows.



Oak Grove Lake Park **409 Bryon Street**

Oak Grove Lake makes up about half of the park's 130 acres. Most of the park's remainder is composed of forest that includes dense growth pines, maples, and tulip poplars. The sizable lake and mixed woodland provides an attractive habitat for dragonflies, butterflies, and songbirds. A 1.5 mile multi-use and ADA-accessible trail circles the perimeter of the 65-acre lake.

A Place for Girls -**Nellie Hayse Site**

912 Cedar Road

Woodland trails, amidst the 8.5-acre natural area behind the Girl Scout program center, offer access to a diversity of ecological habitats including tidal Belles Mill Creek, marsh, a riparian bottomland, and an old pine stand. The woodland trails are worth birding during any season. In the summer, look for warblers, flycatchers and other woodland birds.

Boardwalks over the creek's brackish waters provide views of estuarine species such as killifish, fiddler and blue crabs. The elevated platform overlooking the creek is an excellent place to scan for large wading birds and provides eye-level views of the ospreys that nest nearby. The trail continues to meander past a canoe launch, picnic areas, and for the active naturalist, onto a fitness trail.

Northwest River Park & Campground

1733 Indian Creek Road

Wildlife watching opportunities abound at this 763-acre park, but the Deer Island Trail is of particular interest to birders. Forests interspersed with wetlands offer a variety of woodlands and swamp associated birds, including prothonotary warblers. The park's aquatic habitats, such as riverside wetlands, swampy ponds, and open lake edges along Lake Lesa, attract an array of reptiles and amphibians for the curious visitor to discover.

Dismal Swamp Canal Trail

1246 Dismal Swamp Canal Trail

With 8.5 miles of converted road bed, this multi-use trail allows people of all abilities to explore the wildlife of the Great Dismal Swamp, Running alongside the Dismal Swamp Canal and bordering both Great Dismal Swamp National Wildlife Refuge and Cavalier Wildlife Management Area-Dismal Swamp Tract-this trail offers a variety of habitats in an easily accessible setting. Bird life abounds as well as butterflies and dragonflies. Bear, bobcat, and otter frequent this area. Keep an eye out for any of the numerous reptiles and amphibians that inhabit the swamp. Abutting the single largest tract of land in the region-this trail provides a variety of wonderful wildlife viewing opportunities.

Chesapeake Arboretum

624 Oak Grove Road

The Arboretum consists of 2 acres of gardens, the Caleb Williamson Farmhouse, and 48 acres of woodlands with 3.5 miles of mulched trails. Pick up a trail map from the box along the path near the farmhouse to begin exploring the grounds. Highlights of the trail include crossing a small clear stream that flows through the forest, which attracts reptiles, amphibians, and butterflies and provides a bathing spot for the woodland passerines that frequent the property.

Great Bridge Battlefield & Waterways Museum 1775 Historic Way • 757-482-4480

History lovers unite at the Great Bridge Battlefield & Waterways Museum, near the site of the Battle of Great Bridge. It was at this location patriots had their first victory against the British, creating momentum to fight on for Independence. This battle is credited for having led to the end of the British rule over America.

Adjacent to the museum is **Battlefield Park**, where you can meander through an interpretive trail with educational sign markers while enjoying the outdoors. The park is open to visitors year-round.

Both the Museum and Park are situated on a beautiful stretch of the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway. From this vantage point you can watch the more than 4,000 vessels that ply this waterway annually, or walk the mile loop of wooded trails along the shoreline. The **Dominion Footbridge** offers a majestic view of the marsh, and it is the perfect location to spot water fowl, or even a bald eagle.

Annually, in December, the community comes together for the **Battle** of Great Bridge Reenactment. This weekend heritage celebration is a local's favorite and an opportunity to experience living history.



History

Chesapeake 9/11 Memorial 900 City Park Drive • 757-382-6411





On the grounds of the Great Bridge Battlefield and Waterways Historic Park and Museum, you will learn about William "Billy" Flora (1755-1818), a Revolutionary War Hero of the Battle of Great Bridge in 1775. Also, the story of Lord Dunmore's Ethiopian Regiment is told.

Unknown & Known Afro-Union Civil War Soldiers Memorial 1001 Bells Mill Road

The only memorial of its kind in Virginia dedicated to saluting Afro-Union Soldiers and Sailor Patriot Heroes.

Great Dismal Swamp • 1246 Dismal Swamp Canal Trail

During the American colonial period, groups of enslaved people seeking freedom created communities in heavily wooded and swampy areas. Known as Maroon Communities, many were sustained for generations.

Moses Grandy, whose written account of his life as an enslaved man and skilled waterman, was published in 1843.

The Great Dismal Swamp National Wildlife Refuge is nationally recognized as part of the historic Underground Railroad network.

Dismal Swamp Canal Superintendent's House 3500 Dismal Swamp Canal Trail (off Glencoe Street)

The Dismal Swamp Canal - an 18th century endeavor, was conceived by a group that included George Washington. After 12 years of grueling work, accomplished mostly by enslaved people in highly unfavorable conditions, the canal opened in 1805. Dating back to the late 1700s, the home of the original project's superintendent still stands today on the bank of the canal.

Cornland School • 2309 Benefit Road

Originally built in 1885 by people formerly enslaved, the Cornland School is a historic one-room schoolhouse. It is the only known school of its kind still standing in Coastal Virginia.

Cuffeytown and the Cuffeytown Historic Cemetery 2216 Long Ridge Road

Dating back to the 1800s, Cuffeytown was formed by black people who were born free. It is also known for the Cuffeytown 13, a group of African-Virginian Union Army Civil War Veterans who served in the Colored Troops Infantry Regiments, which were organized in 1863 and 1864.

DISMAL SWAMP CANAL TRAIL







