NOTIFICATION OF APPROVED JURISDICTIONAL DETERMINATION

Dear Mr. Williams and Mr. Owen:

On 20 November 2023, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) received your request for an approved jurisdictional determination (AJD) for the approximately 4,023-acre property, known as Coastal Virginia Commerce Park, which fronts on the east side of Route 17, is situated south of Ballahack Road, and the southern boundary is the VA/NC border (center Latitude 36.570982°, Longitude -76.362705°), in Chesapeake, Virginia.

Based upon a review of the information provided with your request, an onsite and desktop evaluation, 33 CFR 329: Definition of Navigable Waters of the United States, and the Corps' Pre-2015 Regulatory Regime for AJDs considering Sackett v. EPA, 143 S. Ct. 1322 (2023), the Corps determines:

1. The project area contains waters of the U.S., which are, by definition, subject to the requirements of Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 USC 1344). This project area contains relatively permanent waters with an ordinary highwater mark, that flow directly to the Northwest River, a navigable water of the U.S. These features are identified as North Canal, Central Canal, South Canal, and Eastern Canal (cumulatively ~21.38 acres) on the attached project drawing entitled "COASTAL VIRGINIA COMMERCE PARK, FEDERAL WETLANDS EXHIBIT, APPROVED JURISDICTIONAL DETERMINATION, COASTAL VIRGINIA COMMERCE PARK, US ROUTE 17, CHESAPEAKE, VIRGINIA", dated 07 May 2024 by MSA, and date-stamped as received by the Corps on 07 May 2024;

2. The project area contains aquatic resources and/or features which are not waters of the U.S. As such, they are not subject to the requirements of Section 404 of the Clean Water Act nor Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act; however, you may be required to obtain a permit from the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), and we are notifying them by copy of this letter.

Please be aware any discharge of dredged and/or fill material, either permanent or temporary, into a water of the U.S., may require prior approval from the Corps. In addition, you may be required to obtain a Corps authorization for certain activities occurring within, under, or over a water of the U.S. which is also subject to Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act. You may also be required to obtain state and local authorizations, including a Virginia Water Protection Permit from DEQ, a permit from the Virginia Marine Resource Commission (VMRC), and/or from your local wetlands board.

This AJD and/or delineation may not be valid for the Wetland Conservation Provisions of the Food Security Act of 1985, as amended. Therefore, if you or your tenant are U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) program participants, or anticipate participation in USDA programs, you should discuss the applicability of a certified wetland determination with the local USDA service center, prior to starting work.

The Corps relied on the information and data provided by the agent in making our jurisdictional determination. If such information and data are materially false or incomplete, a new AJD would be necessary.

ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS NOTIFICATION

This letter constitutes an AJD for the above-described project area. If you object to this determination, you may request an administrative appeal under Corps regulations (33 CFR Part 331.) Enclosed you will find a Notification of Appeal Process (NAP) fact sheet and Request for Appeal (RFA) form. If you request to appeal this determination you must submit a completed RFA form to the North Atlantic Division Office at the following address:

The Corps will determine whether the RFA is complete and meets the criteria for appeal under 33 CFR 331.5. The RFA must be received at the above address within 60

days of the RFA, and by 15 July 2024. The Corps will not accept incomplete or late RFAs. You do not need to submit an RFA if you concur with our AJD.

This AJD is valid for five years from the date of this notification unless new information (including any changes to the definition of Waters of the United States) warrants revision prior to the expiration date.



SECTION I - The following identifies your rights and options regarding an administrative appeal of the above decision. Additional information may be found at

- A: INITIAL PROFFERED PERMIT: You may accept or object to the permit.
- ACCEPT: If you received a Standard Permit, you may sign the permit document and return it to the district engineer for final
 authorization. If you received a Letter of Permission (LOP), you may accept the LOP and your work is authorized. Your
 signature on the Standard Permit or acceptance of the LOP means that you accept the permit in its entirety, and waive all rights
 to appeal the permit, including its terms and conditions, and approved jurisdictional determinations associated with the permit.
- OBJECT: If you object to the permit (Standard or LOP) because of certain terms and conditions therein, you may request that the permit be modified accordingly. You must complete Section II of this form and return the form to the district engineer. Your objections must be received by the district engineer within 60 days of the date of this notice, or you will forfeit your right to appeal the permit in the future. Upon receipt of your letter, the district engineer will evaluate your objections and may: (a) modify the permit to address all of your concerns, (b) modify the permit to address some of your objections, or (c) not modify the permit having determined that the permit should be issued as previously written. After evaluating your objections, the district engineer will send you a proffered permit for your reconsideration, as indicated in Section B below.
- B: PROFFERED PERMIT: You may accept or appeal the permit
- ACCEPT: If you received a Standard Permit, you may sign the permit document and return it to the district engineer for final authorization. If you received a Letter of Permission (LOP), you may accept the LOP and your work is authorized. Your signature on the Standard Permit or acceptance of the LOP means that you accept the permit in its entirety, and waive all rights to appeal the permit, including its terms and conditions, and approved jurisdictional determinations associated with the permit.
- APPEAL: If you choose to decline the proffered permit (Standard or LOP) because of certain terms and conditions therein, you may appeal the declined permit under the Corps of Engineers Administrative Appeal Process by completing Section II of this form and sending the form to the division engineer. This form must be received by the division engineer within 60 days of the date of this notice.
- C: PERMIT DENIAL: You may appeal the denial of a permit under the Corps of Engineers Administrative Appeal Process by completing Section II of this form and sending the form to the division engineer. This form must be received by the division engineer within 60 days of the date of this notice.
- D: APPROVED JURISDICTIONAL DETERMINATION: You may accept or appeal the approved JD or provide new information.
- ACCEPT: You do not need to notify the Corps to accept an approved JD. Failure to notify the Corps within 60 days of the date of this notice, means that you accept the approved JD in its entirety, and waive all rights to appeal the approved JD.
- APPEAL: If you disagree with the approved JD, you may appeal the approved JD under the Corps of Engineers Administrative Appeal Process by completing Section II of this form and sending the form to the division engineer. This form must be received by the division engineer within 60 days of the date of this notice.

E: PRELIMINARY JURISDICTIONAL DETERMINATION: You do not need to respond to the Corps regarding the preliminary JD. The Preliminary JD is not appealable. If you wish, you may request an approved JD (which may be appealed), by contacting the Corps district for further instruction. Also you may provide new information for further consideration by the Corps to reevaluate the JD.
